#### **MINUTES:**

#### **FINANCIAL REPORT:**

• Merrihew moved to accept the Treasurer's report and pay the accounts payable. Seconded by Schroder.

#### NRCS REPORT:

Andy Keep gave the NRCS report and reported on Post Inflationary Supplemental Payments (PISPs). The current rise in inflation has caused prices of certain commodities that are used for NRCS practices and activities to rise dramatically. The increase was not anticipated when NRCS determined the payment rates associated with conservation practice installations. NRCS is providing an additional payment to producers with certain practices planned in EQIP contracts, as long as those practices are completely installed between January 1<sup>st</sup> through September 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023. Only active EQIP contracts are eligible.

<u>Turner moved to approve the NRCS Report of Planning Activity dated May 2, 2023, to include the Conservation Plans as signed for Chase and Perkins County. Seconded by Swanson.</u>

Jasper reported that the Methodist Church division will be renting the Board room for six months.

#### ASSISTANT MANAGER'S REPORT:

Nate reported that he received word from the Federal government that we have received the WaterSmart grant for \$830,000 for the telemetry project. With this grant and the two State grants that have been received about 90% of the cost should be covered. There are new requirements with Federal grants and Nate is working on these requirements.

Murfin Oil had asked to use our road to get to our neighbor's property but have found out that the landowner does not want them on their property. Murfin stated the since the property was landlocked that we would have to allow them access but our attorney advised that we don't have to allow this.

There is a new program called CRP Grassland. It's a Federal program that pays to incorporate a grazing plan on rangeland. Nate talked to FSA, and they said Rock Creek wouldn't be eligible because it was farmed. Nate contacted the State office, and they said the property could have been farmed. Nate is working with FSA to get this sorted out.
